New Education Policy (2020) for BA/B.SC./B.COM 1ST YEAR STUDENTS UNDER SEMESTER SYSTEM NEP 2020 has been implemented by the H.P. University from the academic session 2026-27 vide notification No. 7- 1/2026-HPU (Acad) dated 13th May 2026. Under the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, Himachal Pradesh University has introduced a flexible, multidisciplinary, and student-centric undergraduate curriculum to promote holistic education, skill development, employability, and academic excellence. The undergraduate programme is based on a semester and credit-based framework with multiple entry and exit options, enabling students to learn at their own pace and according to their interests and career aspirations. The curriculum integrates traditional learning with practical exposure, research orientation, digital literacy, communication skills, value-based education, and experiential learning. During the first year of study, students are offered three core disciplines, along with Multidisciplinary Courses (MDC), Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC), Value-Added Courses (VAC), and Internship/Apprenticeship/Project/Community Outreach components. This structure provides students with opportunities to explore different academic areas and acquire practical and professional skills. At the end of the second semester, students are required to choose their Major and Minor disciplines, which remain applicable throughout the programme in accordance with university regulations. The curriculum also provides flexibility in subject selection across disciplines, thereby encouraging interdisciplinary and outcome-based learning. The NEP framework emphasises continuous assessment, academic flexibility, vocational exposure, research aptitude, innovation, and the effective use of Information and Communication Technology (ICT) in teaching-learning processes. Students are encouraged to participate in internships, community Engagement activities, field projects, seminars, and skill-oriented programmes to enhance their practical knowledge and career readiness. The four-year undergraduate structure also provides students with the opportunity to pursue a Bachelor's Degree with Honours or Honours with Research, subject to the fulfilment of eligibility conditions prescribed by the University. The programme further incorporates the Multiple Entry and Exit System, under which students may exit after one year with a UG Certificate, after two years with a UG Diploma, after successful completion of three years

with a Bachelor's Degree, or continue the fourth year to obtain a Bachelor's Degree with Honours/Honours with Research. This innovative framework ensures greater academic mobility, flexibility, and inclusiveness while preparing students for higher education, competitive examinations, entrepreneurship, and diverse professional careers in the evolving global environment.

NEP 2020 BA/B.COM/B.SC 1st Year Admission Important Guidelines

The Undergraduate Programme in Govt. College Una, affiliated to HP University, Shimla, is as per NEP 2020. Subject pattern for B.A/B.Sc./B.Com. 1st Year

1. DSC - AI
2. DSC- BI
3. Minor Course (MC-1)
4. Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AEC) AEC: The AEC (Skill Enhancement Course) must be chosen out of these three languages, based on the student's academic and career orientation. (ENGLISH/HINDI/SANSKRIT)
5. Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) must be chosen from the DSC or Minor Course.
6. The MDC (Multidisciplinary Course) should be selected from a discipline OTHER THAN the DSC and MC, ensuring it promotes interdisciplinary learning without any overlap.

Example 1:

DSC: HISTORY, POLITICAL SCIENCE

MC: PUBLIC ADMINISTRATION

• **MDC Options:** Mathematics / Sociology/ Computer Science/ English/Geography / Economics / Journalism / Education / etc.

A student enrolled in the undergraduate programme must select two core courses (DSC A1, DSC B1) in the first semester of their degree. These courses are known as discipline-specific courses for UG in Arts, Commerce and Science. The students have to select 1 minor course (MC). Students must choose Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) from the DSC or Minor Course. The MDC (Multidisciplinary Course) should be selected from a discipline OTHER THAN the DSC and MC, ensuring it promotes interdisciplinary learning without any.

Admission Procedure

The entire admission process will be online (<https://govtpgcollegeuna.in>). The duly filled form will be submitted online for verification by the respective committees. Students seeking admission in the first year will be required to appear before the admission committee with their original documents.

Note: The online admission Process can be initiated by clicking on Online Admission 2026- 27 and then “New Candidate registration” on the official website of the college.

Admission for Outstanding Sportsmen/Women (As per HPU Roster)

Admission against the outstanding sports quota would be made at the beginning of the academic session. No forms for such admission would be entertained after the expiry of the last date of submission of forms for admission in the college.

The following categories of certificates would be considered for admission against the outstanding sports quota.

- a) 1st , 2nd , 3rd position holders in Zonal tournaments of Distt./ School Sports Association.
- b) Participation/Position holders in the school state and School/at State and National Level.
- c) 1st, 2nd, and 3rd position holders in PYKKA Dist. Tournaments.
- d) Participation/Position in PYKKA State and National Level Tournaments.
- e) Participation/position in State-level/National-level open tournaments organised by the different recognised Sports Associations.
- f) Participation/Position in Women's State/National Level tournaments organised by autonomous school bodies like Navodaya/KVS/ICSE/DAV Management, etc. The sportsmen/women seeking admission against outstanding sports quota should also qualify for the minimum eligibility conditions for admission in the particular course as provided under the rules.

Admission for Outstanding Performance in Cultural Activities (As per HPU Roster)

1. Admission against outstanding cultural quota would be made once at the beginning of the academic session. No forms for such admission would be entertained after the expiry of the last date of submission of forms for admissions in the College
2. Only those students will be eligible for admission against the outstanding cultural quota who have at least I, II, III or Highly Commended and Commended position in the inter-school Youth Festival, State and National cultural festival in any item in any of the previous three years. should also qualify the minimum eligibility criteria for admission in the particular course as provided under the rules.
3. The distinction in the individual item will be given preference over the Team items. The students seeking admission against the outstanding cultural quota

NOTE: After admission of the ward in any course, the Parent/Guardian will automatically become a member of the college PTA.

DOCUMENTS REQUIRED (To Be Uploaded)

Since the admission process is online, the candidates are required to upload:

1. Photostat copies of all Board/University certificates from Matric onwards.
2. Original copy of Character certificate from the head of the institution last attended.
3. Original Certificates for verification by committee.
4. Two passport-size photographs and one stamp-size photograph for the Identity Card.
5. The candidates from other Boards/Universities must submit:
 - (a) Eligibility certificate from the Board/University showing equivalence.
 - (b) Migration Certificate.
 - (c) SC/ST certificate for those seeking relaxation or weightage.
6. All girl candidates have to submit a copy of a Bonafide Himachali Certificate for getting Exemption from the tuition fee as per the notification. Edu H (8) 3 (8) 1/76 dated 29-06- 2001.
7. Single girl child (Super Numerary seat)
8. Sports / Cultural certificate if any

The admissions are governed by the rules and regulations of H.P. University and are provisional until the final approval is granted by the University.

Eligibility Conditions for UG Classes

A student who has passed 10+2 examination or an equivalent course can seek admission in the first year of a three-year degree course if he/she fulfils the eligibility conditions given below:

1. A candidate seeking admission to the B.A/B.Sc./B.Com. 1st year must have passed 10+2 or an equivalent examination of a Board/University with five subjects including English. The students who have passed their +2 examination with vocational subjects are also eligible to seek admission to BA/B.Sc./B.Com./1st year if otherwise eligible.
2. Minimum percentage of marks obtained at 10+2 level required for admission is:
 - i)

B.A.	(Pass) 33%
B.Sc.	(Pass) 45%
B.Com	(Pass)45%
 - ii) 40% for those who have passed the examination under the Commerce group at the 10+2 level
 - iii) 33% for the girls.

(Notification No. 4-9/2007-H.P.U. Academic dated 9th April 2007.

Conditions

- a. A candidate seeking admission to B.A. 1st year with Mathematics as one of the subjects should have either 45% marks in aggregate or 45% in Mathematics.

- b. A relaxation of 5% marks in the above eligibility criterion is available to SC/ST candidates.
- c. A relaxation of 5% at minimum qualification marks will be given to disabled persons for admission. (Notification No.EDN-H (21) MISC/2003 dated March 2003).
- d. A candidate seeking admission to B.Com. 1st year must have passed with Mathematics or Economics as an elective subject at the 10+2 level.
- e. A candidate seeking admission to B.Sc. 1st year must have passed non- medical/medical at 10+2 level respectively.
- f. Only candidates who have passed the 10+2 examination from the National Institute of Open School will be admitted to BA/ B.Com/B.Sc. 1st year of three-year degree courses as there is no provision of awarding compartment at 10+2 level in the NIOS (Notification no. 4-9/2007- H.P.U. Academic dated 2nd January 2004 and 8th April 2005)
- g. A candidate seeking admission to B.Sc. 1st-year (Computer Applications) must have passed non-medical at the 10+2 level.

Criteria of Age for Admission

Age: - The Candidate should not have attained the age of **23** years (Boys) and **25** years (Girls) as on **01-07-2026**.

NOTE: A 3-year relaxation in the age limit is granted to candidates belonging to SC & ST and specially-abled students for UG classes.

Other Eligibility Conditions

- a. A Candidate furnishing any wrong information will be
- b. punished with cancellation of admission/registration. Suitable disciplinary and legal action will be taken. Dues paid will be forfeited.
- c. All admissions are provisional till these are confirmed/approved by HPU, and the college will assume no responsibility for non-approval of a particular case for any reason, including equivalence cases.
- d. In the absence of an actual marks sheet from the University. /Board in respect of +2 or equivalent exam, where the result is shown in grades/standards, the minimum percentage of marks for each subject given in the standard will be taken into consideration for determining eligibility.
- e. The admission schedule notified by the university will be strictly adhered to. No relaxation will be given in this regard.
- f. Admission is open for all students on a rolling basis, who are otherwise eligible, without waiting for the final result. Roll on System means the student has appeared in the previous year's examination and will go to the next year as per the schedule without waiting for the result of the exam, and so on. However, he/she will have to complete all the formalities, if any, laid down by the college authorities and deposit the prescribed fees.
- g. The decision of the Principal will be final in the matter of admission, and he has the power to refuse or cancel any admission without assigning any reason, even on disciplinary grounds

Refusal of Admission

- a. A candidate who has failed twice in a class in one course/faculty will not be readmitted to the same class/course.
- b. A candidate who fails in all compulsory and elective subjects shall not be readmitted to the same class/course (HPU Handbook Vol 1, p.34, article 3.4)
- c. The student who has been expelled or rusticated from any college affiliated to HP University shall not be re-admitted to any course without the prior permission of the Vice-Chancellor.
- d. A Candidate declared RL (UMC) will not be admitted to the college.
- e. A candidate shall be refused admission if his/her conduct during any previous years in the college has not been satisfactory, or he/she was punished or expelled.
- f. Casual admission in the college will not be allowed to any category of students due to constraints of space in the classrooms or shortage of staff.
- g. The decision of the Principal shall be final in matters of admissions. He/she has the power to refuse or terminate

any admission without assigning any reason or on disciplinary grounds.

Cancellation of Admission

Any candidate seeking admission by furnishing false certificates/information or by suppressing any information in respect of age, subject and percentage of marks will be punished with the cancellation of his/her admission, and suitable disciplinary/legal action will be taken against him/her.

Note: All the admissions are provisional till the same are confirmed /approved by the H.P. University. The college will not be responsible in case of disapproval of admission by the University.

Admission for Post-Graduate Classes

There are forty (40) seats in MA English, (40) seats in MA Pol Science, (40) seats in MA Economics and 40 seats in M.Com. The admission will be done by HP University Norms & procedure.

Rules for Migration

- Original Migration certificate of a Board/University from which the candidate migrates to this College will have to be submitted.
- The migrating student must bring with him/her:
 - I. Lecture attendance statement.
 - II. Statement of marks obtained in the Mid Term Tests.
 - III. Character Certificate from the Head of Institution last attended.
- After the migration has been sanctioned and notified by the University, the student must join the new college within the given period of time, i.e., by the date given by the University.
- On joining a new college, the student will have to pay all the funds for the entire year, whereas the Tuition fees will be payable from the month of their joining the new college.
- No migration certificate can be issued unless the student is registered with the other University.
- A candidate migrating from this college will have to obtain clearance from the college office, the Library, NCC, NSS, sports and other concerned departments.
- The admission of a student migrating from another University shall be treated as provisional and shall be confirmed when he/ she produces the migration certificate; however, if the student is disqualified by any other University, he/she shall not be given admission during the period of disqualification.
- After obtaining a migration certificate from the university, the student must get their college changed online from both colleges.

Note: Migration from another College & Vice Versa is governed by HP University Rules.

Relaxations

- As per Govt. notification No EDN&&H (8)3 (7) 1/76 dated 29-06-2007, all bona fide Himachali girls are exempted from tuition fees. At the time of admission, they will compulsorily have to submit a certificate of permanent residence issued by a Competent Revenue Officer.
- Only real brothers studying in the college are entitled to get a half tuition fee exemption. Out of two, only one can apply for exemption and out of three studying simultaneously, two younger brothers can claim the same, by applying to the Principal, normally in the month of September.

Leave Rules

Leave shall be sanctioned on the prescribed application form obtainable from the college library. The application should be duly signed by the parents/ guardians. Leave shall be granted only on the recommendation of the concerned teachers. Leave for more than a day shall be granted on the basis of a Medical certificate issued by a Registered Medical Officer.

Rules to be observed by the inmates

- No boarder is allowed to go out of the hostel after the scheduled time without the permission of the hostel warden.
- On vacating the hostel, the boarder shall have to produce a 'No Dues' certificate from the Hostel Warden. Boarder has to vacate the hostel within three days of the end of the academic session.
- Ragging is an offence which can result in immediate eviction from the hostel and will attract more stringent actions such as rustication from the college and lodging of an FIR with the police.
- No inmate is allowed to damage the hostel property. If found guilty, strict action will be taken against him.
- No inmate is permitted to take a (bath or wash clothes openly in the premises.

University and House Examinations & attendance

1. It is compulsory to fulfil the Lecture Attendance & House Test conditions laid by the University. In case a student fails to fulfil any of these conditions, he/she will not be allowed to sit in the annual examinations as per the resolution of the university Academic council, which states that a student on the rolls of the college shall be eligible to be admitted to the University Examination, if he/ she.

- i) Has attended 75% of the total lectures delivered in each of the concerned courses in theory as well as in practical.
- ii) Secured 20% marks in each subject or 30% of the aggregate marks in all compulsory and elective subjects in the House Test. The student abstaining from the house test shall be fined as per the rules.

Students' Course-Wise Assessment and Evaluation (For 2nd and 3rd Year only)

All Courses involve an evaluation system of students that has the following two components

(a) Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA)

Accounting for 30% of the final grade that the student gets in a course, and

(b) End-of-Semester Examination

Accounting for the remaining 70% of the final grade that the student gets in a course.

Note: A student will have to pass both the components (i.e. CCA and ESE) separately with 35% marks each and 40% in aggregate to become eligible to be declared successful in a course.

CCA will comprise:

- a. Mid -Term Maximum Marks -15
The mid-term test will be conducted by the college
- b. Seminar / Assignment Maximum Marks -10
- c. Attendance Minimum requirement 75% Maximum Marks -05

Note: - Internal Assessment scheme for P. G. classes has been introduced by HPU for which 20% of the maximum marks in each paper are to be further subdivided as:

- a. Weightage for attendance- 5%
- b. Performance in any one of the following- 15%
 1. Assignment writing.
 2. Seminar Presentation.

Readmission: The names of the students who remain absent for ten days continuously from any class without proper sanctioned leave shall be struck off from the college rolls. However, the Principal, at his discretion and after the recommendation from the teacher concerned, may re- admit such students on paying the re-admission fees as mentioned below on a prescribed Proforma within 10 days of striking the name.

Readmission Fees

First time: Rs. 100/- Second Time: Rs. 200/-

No student will be readmitted for the third time in a session.

Library Rules

1. There is a provision for library cards for the students who wish to avail themselves of the library facilities. The library card can be obtained from the Library in charge on production of an identity Card.
2. A Book issued can be kept for a period of 15 days. Delay will be charged @Rs. 1/- per day.
3. Textbooks and reference books will not be issued.
4. U.G. students in all streams can borrow a maximum of 3 books at a time.
5. The books must be handled carefully. Any loss or damage will have to be paid for with the special permission of the principal.

College Magazine (Sombhadra)

The college Magazine "SOMBHADRA" is brought out every year to provide a forum to the students for an expression of their creative talents in the form of articles, poems, stories, etc. It also contains the selected photographs of different college activities and those of students who excel in different fields during the session.

Tutorial Management Cell

In order to encourage interaction between students and teachers, the Tutorial Groups are created. The students can discuss their problems with their tutors.

Students Grievance Redressal Cell

In accordance with the UGC (Redressal of Grievances of Students) Regulations, 2023, with an objective to provide opportunities for redressal of certain grievances of students already enrolled in any institution, as well as those seeking admission to such institutions, and a mechanism for the students' Grievance Redressal

committee (SGRC) has been formed in the college, which will consider the grievances of aggrieved students (defined as per the provisions of the UGC Act, 1956 (3 of 1956),

following the principles of natural justice. The SGRC shall send its report with recommendations, if any, to the competent authority within a period of 15 working days from the date of receipt of the complaint.

IGNOU

A Study Centre of Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU) is working in the college. The Study Centre provides courses in various disciplines; Undergraduate and postgraduate courses, along with diplomas in various categories. It caters to the needs of professionals as well as students who want to pursue these courses as a part-time arrangement. Around 4000 students are benefiting from this Study Centre.

N.C.C., N.S.S., Rovers & Rangers

1. **NCC:** -There is a provision for NCC (both girls and boys) in the college. Enrolment begins with the commencement of the session.

2. **NSS-** National Service Scheme (N. S. S.) is currently having two units in this college with enrolment of one hundred volunteers each under the guidance of a Programme Officer for each unit. These units are engaged in regular as well as Special Camp activities in and around the college, in the spirit of the scheme. Enrolment is by selection within a month of admission to the college.

3. **ROVERS AND RANGERS-** The Bharat Scouts and Guides is a voluntary organisation. It is devoted to developing the character of the younger generation and to selfless service to the country. The college has two rover and ranger units for boys and girls aged 17 to 25. One group consists of 24 Rovers and 24 Rangers. The Rovers and Rangers are sent to attend the training camps from time to time and are engaged in various college activities and functions, resulting in great learning for them.

Sports & Co-Curricular Activities

The college provides excellent facilities to sports persons. The disciplines in which the college prepares teams for the University Championship include Athletics, Boxing, Chess, Cricket, Hockey, Football, Volleyball, Badminton, and Handball. The students are trained

by experienced coaches. A committee of teachers actively participates in selecting college teams for various events.

The college also provides guidance to students in various cultural activities for participation in HPU Youth Festival Groups I to IV.

Community Participation

(a) PTA (Parent Teacher Association): The PTA body was constituted in the 2004- 05 session to work for the overall development of the college. Elections to this body are held every year. All parents/guardians are requested to spare their valuable time for the General Body meeting of PTA as and when the date is notified.

(b) OSA (Old Students Association): An Old Students Association comprising the Alumni of this college has been constituted w.e.f. session 2004-05. Apart from the nostalgic reasons, this association has been constituted to make a contribution towards the developmental activities of their alma mater.

Central Students College Association (CSCA)

The CSCA of the college students is elected at the beginning of the session in accordance with the university rules. The body helps the college authorities maintain discipline in the college and facilitate developmental activities. For many years now, the CSCA has been nominated on the basis of merit, as election to this association has been discontinued.

Award of Prizes in Annual Function

Prizes are given to the students securing positions in the University/House examination, sports, and other extracurricular activities. The prize money is decided by the Advisory Committee.

Academic Prizes

1. Students securing first to tenth position in the HPU /Annual Examination.
2. Ist/ 2nd/ 3rd position in the college in aggregate in H. P Annual/House examination and I/II position in all subjects in the college in HPU Annual/ House examination.

Sports, Cultural & Co-Curricular Prizes

1. Participation in International Events, Gold/ Silver/ Bronze Medal in Inter- varsity/Inter-

college championships, Annual College Athletic Meet and championship in Intra- College events.

2. Youth Festival prizes would be at par with the sports prizes.
3. NCC/NSS students participating in RD Parade, NCC Cadets appointed as SUO and UO for the session and declared the Best Cadet.
4. NSS volunteers appointed president/ declared Best Volunteer in each unit (M& F both).
5. SCA Office bearers be given Blazer Cloth at the time of the Oath-taking ceremony.
6. Rangers & Rovers participation in State Level Camp.
7. Blood Donors, special prizes for extraordinary contributions to the college activities.

Rules & Guidelines for Educational Tours

1. Faculty-wise educational tours will be allowed during vacations/gazetted holidays. Preference will be given to the senior classes. The willing students must apply for the educational tour at least 20 days in advance in case of journey by bus and 45 days in advance in case of journey by train.
2. A written consent of a college official/ teacher who will accompany the tour, the tour programme/diary, NOC/ bus fare certificate from HRTC and the list of students with name, father's name, class, roll number and signatures of students must be submitted to the tour committee at least five days before proceeding on tour.
3. An undertaking/ indemnity bond on a Proforma supplied by the college must be submitted by the parents of the students who are going on tour.
4. The students must deposit the tour charges to the tour manager at least 5 days before proceeding on tour, as decided by the authorities. A detailed report on the learning and experiences of the tour should be submitted to the tour committee within 15 days of the tour's completion.
5. Educational tours shall be flagged off by the tour Committee from the college campus after completion of all the formalities, and finally with intimation to the Pri

Code of Conduct

1. In the college premises, every student must be in possession of their valid Identity Card & must wear it throughout till she is on college premises or representing the college at any other place. Whenever demanded by the authorities concerned, the Identity Card must be produced for inspection.
2. Students must maintain strict discipline and decorum on the college campus.
3. Students should be Punctual in attending their classes.
4. Students are not allowed to attend classes other than their own without the prior permission of the Principal.
5. Students are not permitted to bring any outsiders to the College Campus without prior permission from the Principal.
6. A student must attend all the tests, tutorials and examinations conducted by the College.
7. Every student must complete all the academic work assigned to her class by the respective teachers, such as the completion of Practical Journal, Home Assignments, Field Diary, Project, etc., in time.
8. No student should loiter in the corridor or on the college campus during lecture hours. When they are free, they should go to the library / common room/canteen. No student is permitted to miss lectures and sit in the canteen/common room/library.
9. Students are not allowed to go out of the College premises, in between the lecture periods or practical, without the permission of the Class in charge Teacher / Principal.

10. Every student must always be modestly dressed and observe decorum with regard to both clothing and behaviour, and should take utmost care not to disturb the working of her own class as well as that of others. For self-financing courses, students will have a uniform approved by the management.

11. Students are not allowed to organise picnics/ activities without prior permission from the Principal.

12. No student shall collect any money as a contribution towards picnics, trips, educational tours, get-togethers, study notes, charity or any other activity without the prior permission of the College Principal.

13. Every student should take utmost care of the college property to keep the College premises neat, tidy and clean for the common welfare of all. Any willful damage to the property of the College will be dealt with as a breach of discipline and is liable for punishment. Such incidents should promptly be reported to the College Principal.

14. Students are requested to take care of their own property. The College Authorities are not responsible for the loss of any personal belongings of the students.

15. Students should deposit any lost property found by them in the College Office. Such incidents are displayed on the Notice Board. Owners of lost property should enquire and claim the same from the office.

16. If a student remains absent without giving a leave application for a sizable length of time, her name is liable to be removed from the College rolls.

17. Students who fail to maintain the condition of minimum attendance on account of bona fide illness, or any other reason which is deemed right by the Principal, should apply in writing to the Principal for leave of absence, prior or

within 2 days from the date of commencement of such leave, failing which they will be treated as defaulters. Application forms are available at our office within 2 days of returning from leave (in case of illness).

18. Absence of the student on valid grounds at lectures/practicals/tutorials/tests/examinations must be communicated to the College Principal immediately in writing with the necessary supporting documents viz. Medical certificate etc. through the respective class teacher.

19. Students who request leave of absence from lectures/practical/tutorials for participation in sports, games, cultural or any other activities for and on behalf of the College/ Activity group, should submit the applications countersigned by the respective Teacher -in-charge before the commencement of such leave, failing which they will be treated as defaulters.

20. Parents/ Guardians if accompanying students should sign the visitors register at the gate and maintain decorum in the college.

21. All other relatives are directed to obtain written permission from the principal if they want to represent any student.

22. Parents of students are requested to kindly contact the Teacher-in-charge of class, Head of Department, Principal, at least once in a term, to keep themselves in touch with their ward's attendance and progress.

23. Counseling center and Mentor System: It has been observed that some of the students have personal problems, causing stress and strain. The college has appointed a councilor to help such students to cope with these problems. The students/ parents are requested to make use of this facility. All matters will be kept confidential. The college has also set up mentor System having teacher mentor to guide the students in their difficulties. In case of any problem, personal or

academic, students should report to the teacher-in-charge Mentor teacher who will help them solve their problems.

24. No society, association, committee, organization of students should be formed in the College without the sanction of the Principal.

25. Outsiders should not be invited to address any meeting or to participate in any college activity without the prior permission of the Principal.

26. A teacher conducting a class at a given time shall be in absolute control of the class, and may take appropriate action in order to maintain discipline in the class.

27. Any member of the teaching or non-teaching staff may intervene on the spot to deal with disorderly/ destructive activities on the part of the students either in the class room or outside the class room in the College premises.

28. Any matter not covered by the rules and regulation in vogue and/or notified through notices, circular, prospectus etc., will rest at the absolute discretion of the Principal. The right of interpretation of any rule is reserved by the Principal.

29. All rules and regulations enforced and implemented by the college / Management / U.G.C / University / Government from time to time will remain binding on students.

30. Any cost incurred by the college on account of communication owing to indiscipline/default of attendance / not appearing for mandatory internal examinations / viva / not submitting projects by students / any other matters pertaining to college administration related to students will be recovered from the concerned student.

RAGGING: A PUNISHABLE OFFENCE

PROHIBITION OF RAGGING UNDER H.P. EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTION ACT

(PROHIBITION OF RAGGING ACT ,2009) defines ‘Ragging’ as doing any act, by disorderly conduct, to a student of an educational institution ,which causes or is likely to cause physical or psychological harm or raising apprehension or fear or shame or embarrassment to the student.

Such disorderly conduct includes, teasing or abusing or playing practical jokes on or causing hurt to such students or asking a student to do any act or perform something which such student ,will not be willing to do in the ordinary course

A student who commits the offence of ragging shall be punishable with a imprisonment for a term which may extend to three years or shall also be liable to the fine which may extend Rs.50,000/- or both.

If a student is convicted of the charges of committing, abetting, participating or propagating ragging , he shall be dismissed from the college and such student will not get admission in any other college for a period of three years from the date of his dismissal from the college.

6. Bringing outsiders to the campus.
7. Tampering with electrical fittings, fans, etc.
8. Misbehaviour of any kind.
9. Misbehaviour with female students.
10. Use of cell phones in classrooms, library, and on campus and unauthorised use of loudspeakers, Public address systems. The teaching staff is vested with the right to punish or recommend punishment for any activity that amounts to a breach of discipline.
