Categories Of Courses

The Under Graduate (TDC) Programme in Govt. College Una affiliated to HP University, Shimla is for a minimum period of three years and a maximum of five years from the date of admission of the candidate and will comprise of the following categories of courses:

- 1. Elective/Core Courses (DSEs)
- 2. Compulsory Courses (For BA & B. Com)
- 3. Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECCs)
- 4. Skill Enhancement Courses (SECs)
- 5. Generic Elective (GEs)

1. Elective/ Core Courses (DSEs):

a student enrolled in the undergraduate programme will have to select certain elective or core courses in the first year of their degree. These courses are known as discipline specific Elective courses (DSEs) for UG in Arts and Commerce, the students have to select 2 Elective/ Core courses. For UG in Science stream the students have to select 3 Elective/ Core courses. These Elective or Core courses continue in the second and final year of the UG Programme.

2. Compulsory Courses (For BA & B. Com):

I Compulsory English

II Compulsory Hindi/compulsory Sanskrit

These Two Compulsory courses are selected in the first year of UG and are studied in the First and Second year of the UG programme.

3. Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECCs):

4.

- I. English/Hindi/ Sanskrit
- II. Environment Study

These Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECCs) are selected and studied by the students of BA, B. Com & B.Sc. in the first year of UG Programme.

5. Skill Enhancement Courses (SECs):

The students have to study two SECs which are to be taken by them from their Elective or Core Courses. Skill Enhancement Courses (SECs) are to be taken in the Second year of UG Programme and are studied in the second and final year of UG Programme.

6. Generic Elective (GEs):

The students will have to study two Generic Elective Courses (GEs) in the final year of UG programme which are to be taken by them. In case of BA, the GEs have to be selected from the (other than)

For B.Sc. and B.Com the Generic Elective Courses (GEs) have to be selected from the already taken Elective or Core courses.

Subject Combinations Allowed

Basket 1: Economics, Education, Music (Instrumental), Music (vocal), History, Journalism

(Subject combination in this basket may be allowed with the combination mentioned in basket 2 and basket 3)

Basket 2: Mathematics, Political science, Public Administration, Tour and Travel

(Subject combination allowed in this basket may be allowed with the combination mentioned in basket 1 and basket 3)

Basket 3: English, Hindi, Sanskrit, Geography, Sociology

(Subject combination allowed in this basket may be allowed with the combination mentioned in basket 1 and basket 2)

Admission Procedure

- i) The Candidates are advised to go through the prospectus carefully before filling up the admission forms.
- ii) The filled-up form, complete in all respects, must be deposited with the admission committees designated for the purpose, so that they are able to compile the data in time, for the display of merit list.
- iii) The Roster for admission and reservation printed prominently in the prospectus will be applied for admissions to all courses. Candidates applying for admission under various categories will have to specify their categories and abide by the norms applicable to various categories.
- iv) The candidates will attach the self-attested Photostat copies of their documents with the admission forms. They must bring all their original documents/certificates at the time of final admission after the display of merit list. The onus of proving the authenticity of their documents in case of any challenges lies with the candidate concerned.
- v) The final merit list will be displayed prominently on various notice boards in the college campus. The candidates figuring in the merit list must report to the concerned admission committee on the specified day and complete the formalities on the same day. They must deposit their dues on the same day. Provisions have been made to assign a single counter for the admission process so that students do not face any problems.
- vi) No request for change of subjects will be entertained.
- vi) The candidates must ensure that their admission forms bear the signature of their parents/guardians, as per rules. Signature of any other person (not related) will be considered illegal.

Note: Online admission Process can be initiated by clicking on Online Admission 2023-24 and then New Candidate registration on the official website of College. Students may follow the steps of admission through video already uploaded on the website.

Admission for Outstanding Sportsmen/Women (As per HPU Roster)

Admission against outstanding sports quota would be made once in the beginning of the academic session. No forms for such admission would be entertained after expiry of the last date of submission of forms for admission in the college.

The following categories of certificates would be considered for admission against outstanding sports quota.

- a) Ist, 2nd, 3rd position holders in Zonal tournaments of Distt./ School Sports Association.
- b) Participation/Position holders in school state and School/at State and National Level.
- (c) 1st, 2nd, 3rd position holders in PYKKA Dist. Tournaments.
- c) Participation/Position in PYKKA State and National Level Tournaments.
- e) Participation/position in State level/National level open tournaments organized by the different recognized Sports Associations.
- f) Participation/Position in Women's State/National Level tournaments organized by autonomous school bodies like Navodaya/KVS/ICSE/DAV Management etc. The sportsmen/women seeking admission against outstanding sports quota should also qualify the minimum eligibility conditions for admission in the particular course as provided under the rules.

Admission for Outstanding Performance in Cultural Activities (As per HPU Roster)

- 1. Admission against outstanding cultural quota would be made once in the beginning of the academic session. No forms for such admission would be entertained after expiry of the last date of submission of forms for admissions in the College
- 2. Only those students will be eligible for admission against outstanding cultural quota that have at least I, II, III or Highly Commended and Commended position inter-School Youth Festival, State and National cultural festival in any item in any of the previous three years.

3. The distinction in the individual item will be given preference over the Team items. The students seeking admission against outstanding cultural quota should also qualify the minimum eligibility criteria for admission in the particular course as provided under the rules.

NOTE: After admission of the ward in any course, the Parent/Guardian will automatically become a member of the college PTA.

DOCUMENTS REQUIRED (To Be Uploaded)

Since the admission process is online, the candidates are required to upload:

- 1. Photostat copies of all Board/University certificates from Matric onwards.
- 2. Original copy of Character certificate from the head of institution last attended.
- 3. Original Certificates for verification by committee.
- 4. Two passport size photographs and one stamp size for the Identity Card.
- 5. The candidates from other Boards/University, must submit:
- (a) Eligibility certificate from the Board/University showing equivalence.
- (b) Migration Certificate.
- (c) SC/ST certificate for those seeking relaxation or weightage.
- 6. All girl candidates have to submit a copy of Bonafide Himachali Certificate for getting Exemption from Tuition fee as per Notification. Edu H (8) 3 (8) 1/76 dated 29-06-2001.
- 7. Only single girl child (Super Numerary seat)
- 8. Sports / Cultural certificate if any

The admissions are governed by the rules and regulations of H.P. University and are provisional till the final approval by the University.

Eligibility Conditions for UG Classes

A student who has passed 10+2 examination or an equivalent course can seek admission in the first year of three-year degree course if he/she fulfils the eligibility conditions given below:

1. A candidate seeking admission to the B.A/B.Sc./B.Com. 1st year must have Passed 10+2 or an equivalent examination of a Board/University with five subjects including English. The students who have passed their +2 examination with vocational subjects are also eligible to seek admission in BA/B.Sc./B.Com/ 1st year,

if otherwise eligible.

2. Minimum percentage of marks obtained at 10+2 level required for admission is:

B.A. (Pass) 33%

B.Sc. (Pass) 45%

B.Com i) (Pass)45%

ii) 40% for those who have passed examination under Commerce group at 10+2 level

iii) 33% for the girls.

(Notification No. 4-9/2007-H.P.U. Academic dated 9th April 2007).

Conditions

- i) A candidate seeking admission to B.A. 1st year with Mathematics as one of the subjects should have either 45% marks in aggregate or 45% in Mathematics.
- ii) A relaxation of 5% marks in above eligibility criterion is available to SC/ST candidates.
- iii) A relaxation of 5% at minimum qualification marks will be given to disabled persons for admission. (Notification No.EDN-H (21) MISC/2003 dated March, 2003).
- iv) A candidate seeking admission to B.Com. 1st year must have passed Mathematics or Economics as an elective subject at 10+2 level.
- v) A candidate seeking admission to B.Sc. 1st year must have passed nonmedical/medical at 10+2 level respectively.
- vi) Only pass candidates of 10+2 examination from National Institute of open school will be admitted in BA/B.Com/B.Sc. 1styear of three years degree courses as there is no provision of awarding compartment at10+2 level in the NIOS (Notification no. 4-9/2007-H.P.U. Academic dated 2nd January 2004 and 8th April 2005)
- vii) A candidate seeking admission to B.Sc. 1st year (Computer Applications) must have passed non-medical at 10+2 level.

Criteria of Age for Admission

Age: - For Girls 23 years as on 1st July 2023 and for boys 21 years as on 1st July 2023. However, the Vice Chancellor can grant 6 months relaxation for genuine reasons.

NOTE: - Relaxation of 3 years in age limit is granted to the candidates belonging to SC & ST both for UG and PG classes.

Other Eligibility Conditions

- 1. A Candidate furnishing any wrong information will be punished with cancellation of admission/registration. Suitable disciplinary and legal action will be taken. Dues paid will be forfeited.
- 2. All admissions are provisional till these are confirmed/approved by HPU and the college will assume no responsibility for non-approval of a particular case for any reason, including equivalence cases.
- 3. In absence of actual marks sheet from Univ./Board in respect of +2 or equivalent exam where the result is shown in grades/standards the minimum percentage of marks for each subject given in standard will be taken into consideration for determining eligibility.
- 4. The admission schedule notified by the university will be strictly adhered to. No relaxation will be given in this regard.
- 5. Admission is open for all students on Roll on Basis, who are otherwise eligible without waiting for final result. Roll on System means the student has appeared in the previous year examination and will go to next year as per schedule without waiting for the result of exam, and so on. However, he/she will have to complete all the formalities laid down by the college authorities if any, and depositing the prescribed fees.
- 6. The decision of the Principal will be final in the matter of admission and he has the power to refuse or cancel any admission without assigning any reason even on disciplinary ground

Refusal of Admission

- 1. A candidate who has failed twice in a class in one course/faculty will not be readmitted to the same class/course.
- 2. A candidate who fails in all compulsory and elective subjects shall not be readmitted to same class/course (HPU Hand Book Vol.1 p.34 article 3.4)
- 3. The student who has been expelled or rusticated from any college affiliated to HP University shall not be re-admitted to any course without the prior permission of Vice-Chancellor.
- 4. A Candidate declared RL (UMC) will not be admitted in the college.
- 5. A candidate shall be refused admission if his/her conduct during any previous years in the college has not been satisfactory or he/she was punished or expelled.
- 6. Casual admission in the college will not be allowed to any category of students due to constraint of space in the classrooms or shortage of staff.
- 7. The decision of the Principal shall be final in matter of admissions. He/she has the power to refuse or terminate any admission without assigning any reason or on disciplinary ground.

Cancellation of Admission

Any candidate seeking admission by furnishing false certificates/information or by suppressing any information in respect of age, subject and percentage of marks will be punished with the cancellation of his/her admission and suitable disciplinary/legal action will be taken against him/her.

Note: All the admissions are provisional till the same are confirmed /approved by the H.P.University. The college will not be responsible in case of disapproval of admission by the University.

Admission for Post-Graduate Classes

There are forty (40) seats in MA English, (40) seats in MA Pol Science, (40) seats in MA Economics and 40 seats in M.Com. The admission will be done by HP University Norms & procedure.

Rules for Migration

- Original Migration certificate of a Board/University from which the candidate migrates to this College will have to be submitted.
- The migrating student must bring with him/her:
- I) Lecture attendance statement.
- II) Statement of marks obtained in the Mid Term Tests.
- III) Character Certificate from the Head of Institution last attended.
- After the migration has been sanctioned and notified by the University, the student must join the new college within the given period of time i.e.by the date given by the University.
- On joining new college, the student will have to pay all the funds for the entire year whereas the Tuition fees will be payable from the month of his joining the new college.
- No migration certificate can be issued unless the student is registered with the other University.
- A candidate migrating from this college will have to obtain clearance from the college office, Library, NCC, NSS, sports and other concerned departments.
- The admission of a student migrating from another University shall be treated as provisional and shall be confirmed when he/ she produces the migration certificate and however, that the student disqualified by any other University, shall not be given admission during the period of disqualification.

• After obtaining migration certificate from the university the student must get their college changed online from both the colleges.

Note: Migration from another College & Vice Versa is governed by HP University Rules.

The eligible students have to produce their income certificate at the time of applying for the scholarship for first time. (Notification No.EDN-H (10) B 2005-06 misc-dated 30 Jan. 2006) For further details contact the college office.

Relaxations

1. As per Govt. notification No EDN&&H (8)3 (7) 1/76 dated 29-06-2007 all Bonafide Himachali girls are exempted from tuition fees. At the time of admission, they will compulsorily have to submit a certificate of permanent residence issued by a Competent Revenue Officer.

2. Only real brothers studying in the college are entitled to get half tuition fee exemption. Out of two, only one can apply for exemption and out of three studying simultaneously, two younger brothers can claim the same, by applying to the Principal, normally in the month of September.

Leave Rules

Leave shall be sanctioned on the prescribed application form obtainable from the college library. The application should be duly signed by the parents/ guardians Leave shall be granted only on the recommendation of concerned teachers. Leave for more than a day shall be granted on the basis of a Medical certificate issued by a Registered Medical Officer.

Rules to be observed by the inmates

- 1. Entry of outsiders in the hostel is strictly banned.
- 2. Use of drugs, intoxicants and smoking are strictly prohibited. Anyone found indulging in these will be asked to evict the hostel immediately.
- 3. No inmate will be allowed to use electrical appliances & tape recorders in the room.
- 4. No boarder is allowed to go out of hostel after the scheduled time without the permission of Hostel Warden.
- 5. On vacating the hostel, the boarder shall have to produce 'No Dues' certificate from the Hostel Warden. Boarder has to vacate the hostel within three days of the end of Academic Session.
- 6. Ragging is an offence which can result in immediate eviction from the hostel and will attract more stringentactions such as rustication from the college and lodging of FIR with the police.
- 7. No inmate is allowed to damage the hostel property, If found guilty strict action will be taken against him.
- 8. No inmate is permitted to take bath or wash clothes openly in the premises.
- 9. Parking Vehicles inside the hostel building is prohibited.

University and House Examinations & attendance

- 1. It is compulsory to fulfil Lecture Attendance & House Test condition laid by the University. In case a student fails to fulfil any of these conditions he/she will not be allowed to sit in the annual examinations as per the resolution of the university Academic council which states that a student on the rolls of the college shall be eligible to be admitted to the University Examination, if he/she.
- i) Has attended 75% of the total lectures delivered in each of the concerned courses in theory as well as in practical.
- ii) Secured 20% marks in each subject or 30% of the aggregate marks in all compulsory and Elective Subject in the House Test. The student abstaining from house test shall be fined as per rules.

Students Course Wise Assessment and Evaluation

All Courses involve an evaluation system of students that has following two components

(a) Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA)

Accounting for 30% of the final grade that the student gets in a course, and

(b) End Semester Examination

Accounting for the remaining 70% of the final grade that the student gets in a course.

Note: A student will have to pass both the components (i.e. CCA and ESE) separately with 35% marks each and 40% in aggregate to become eligible to be declared successful in a course.

CCA will comprise of:

a. Mid -Term Maximum Marks -15

Mid- Term Test will be conducted by the college

- b. Seminar / Assignment Maximum Marks -10
- c. Attendance Minimum requirement 75% Maximum Marks -05

2. The name of the students who remain absent for ten days continuously from any class without proper sanctioned leave shall be struck off from the college rolls. However, the Principal at his discretion and after the recommendation from teacher concerned; may readmit such students on paying the re admission fees as mentioned below on a prescribed Proforma within 10 days of striking of the name.

Readmission Fees

First time: Rs. 100/- Second Time: Rs. 200/-

No student will be readmitted for the third time in a session.

Note: - Internal Assessment scheme for P. G. classes has been introduced by HPU for which 20% of Maximum Marks in each paper are to be further sub – divided as:

- a. Weightage for attendance- 5%
- b. Performance in any one of the following- 15%
- 1. Assignment writing.
- 2. Seminar Presentation.

Library Rules

- 1. There is a provision for library cards for the students who wish to avail the library facilities. The library card can be had from the Library in charge on production of identity Card.
- 2. A Book issued can be kept for a period of 15 days. Delay will be charged @Rs. 1/- per Day.
- 3. Text books and reference books will not be issued.

- 4. U.G. students in all streams can borrow maximum upto 3 books at a time.
- 5. The books must be handled carefully. Any loss or damage will

have tobe paid for with special permission of the principal.

College Magazine (Sombhadra)

The college Magazine "SOMBHADRA" is brought out every year to provide a forum to the students for an expression of their creative talents in form of articles, poems stories etc. It also contains the selected photographs of different college activities and that of students who excel in different fields during the session.

Tutorial Management Cell

In order to encourage interaction between students and teachers, the Tutorial Groupsare created. The students can discuss their problems with their tutors.

Students Grievance Redressal Cell

In accordance with the UGC (Redressal of Grievances of Students) Regulations, 2023, with an objective to provide opportunities for redressal of certain grievances of students already enrolled in any institution, as well as those seeking admission to such institutions, and a mechanism thereto to a student 's Grievance Redressal

committee (SGRC) has been formed in the college which will consider the grievances of aggrieved students (defined as per the provisions of the UGC Act,1956 (3 of 1956)) following principles of natural justice. The SGRC shall send its report with recommendations, if any, to the competent authority within a period of 15 working days from the date of receipt of complaint.

IGNOU

A Study Centre of Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU) is working in the college with Dr. Meeta Sharma as its coordinator. The Study Centre provides courses in various disciplines; Undergraduate and Post graduate courses along with diplomas in various categories. It caters to the need of professionals as well as students who want to pursue these courses as a part time arrangement. Around 4000 students are being benefitted by this Study Centre.

N.C.C., N.S.S., Rovers & Rangers

- 1.NCC: -There is a provision for NCC (both girls and boys) in the college. Enrolment begins with the commencement of the session.
- 2. NSS- National Service Scheme (N. S. S.) is currently having two units in this college with enrolment of one hundred volunteers each under the guidance of a Programme Officer for each unit. These units are engaged in regular as well as Special Camp activities in and around the college, as envisaged under the spirit of the scheme. Enrolment is by selection within a month of the admission in the college.
- 3. ROVERS AND RANGERS- The Bharat scouts and Guides is an organization, devoted to the development of character of the young generation and selfless service to

the country. There are more than 250 million people in 216 countries with 153 internationally recognized organization under the umbrella of Scout and Guides. The movement is steadily marching ahead in Himachal Pradesh. A unit of the organization is active in the college.

Sports & Co-Curricular Activities

The college provides excellent facilities to sports persons. The disciplines in which the college prepares teams for University Championship are: Athletics, Boxing, Chess Cricket, Hockey, Football, Volleyball, Badminton, Handball etc. The students are trained by experienced coaches. A committee of teachers actively participates in the selection of college teams for various events.

The college also provides guidance to students in various cultural activities for participation in HPU Youth Festival Group I to IV.

Community Participation

- (a) PTA (Parent Teacher Association): The PTA body has been constituted we session 2004-05 to work for the overall development of the college. Election to this body is held every year. All parents/guardians are requested to spare their valuable time for the General Body meeting of PTA as and when the date is notified.
- (b) OSA (Old Students Association): An Old Students Association comprising of the Alumni of this college has been constituted w.e.f. session 2004-05. Apart from the nostalgic reasons, this association has been constituted to make a contribution towards developmental activities of their alma mater.

Central Students College Association (CSCA)

The CSCA of the college students is elected in the beginning of the session according to the university rules. The body helps the college authorities to maintain discipline in the college as well as facilitate and the developmental activities. For many years now, the CSCA is nominated on the basis of merit as election to this association has been discontinued.

Award of Prizes in Annual Function

Prizes are given to the students securing positions in the University/House examination sports and other extracurricular activities .The prize money is decided by the Advisory Committee.

Academic Prizes

- 1. Students securing first to tenth position in HPU /Annual Examination.
- 2. Ist/ 2nd/ 3rd position in the college in aggregate in H. P Annual/House examination and I/II position in all subjects in the college in HPU Annual/ House examination.

Sports, Cultural & Co- Curricular Prizes

- 1. Participation in International Events, Gold/ Silver/ Bronze Medal in Inter- varsity/
 Inter college championships Annual College Athletic Meet and championship in IntraCollege events.
- 2. Youth Festival prizes would be at par with the sports prizes.
- 3. NCC/NSS students participating in RD Parade, NCC Cadets appointed as SUO and UO for thesession and declared the Best Cadet.
- 4. NSS volunteers appointed president/ declared Best Volunteer in each unit (M& F both).
- 5. SCA Office bearers be given Blazer Cloth at the time of Oath taking ceremony.
- 6. Rangers & Rovers participation in State Level Camp.

7.Blood Donors, special prizes for extra ordinary contribution in the college activities.

Rules & Guidelines for Educational Tours

- 1. Faculty wise educational tours will be allowed during vacations/ gazetted holidays. Preference will be given to the senior classes. The willing students must apply for the educational tour at least 20 days in advance in case of journey by bus and 45 days in advance case of journey by train.
- 2. A written consent of college official/ teacher who will accompany the tour, the tour programme/diary, NOC/ bus fare certificate from HRTC and the list of students with name, father's name, class, roll number and signatures of students must be submitted to the tour committee at least five days before proceeding on tour.
- 3. An undertaking/ indemnity bond on a Proforma supplied by the college must be submitted by the parents of the students who are going on tour.
- 4. The students must deposit the tour charges to the tour manager at least 5 days before proceeding on tour as decided by the authorities. A detailed report regardinglearning and experiences of tour should be submitted to the tour committee within 15 days after completion of the tour.
- 5. Educational tours shall be flagged off by the tour Committee from the college campus after completion of all the formalities and finally with intimation to the Principal.

Code of Conduct

- 1. In the college premises every student must be in possession of her valid Identity Card& must wear it throughout till she is on college premises or representing the college at any other place. Whenever demanded by the authorities concerned, the Identity Card must be produced for inspection.
- 2. Students must maintain strict discipline and decorum in the college campus.
- 3. Students should be Punctual in attending their classes.
- 4. Students are not allowed to attend classes other than their own, without the prior permission of the Principal.
- 5. Students are not permitted to bring any outsiders to the College Campus without prior permission of the Principal.
- 6. A student must attend all the tests, tutorials and examinations conducted by the College.
- 7. Every student must complete, all the academic work assigned to her class by the respective teachers, such as the completion or Practical Journal, Home Assignments, Field Diary, Project etc., in time.
- 8. No student should loiter in the corridor or college campus during lecture hours. When they are free, they should go to the library / common room / canteen. No student is permitted to miss the lectures and sit in the canteen / common room/library.
- 9. Students are not allowed to go out of the College premises, in between the lecture periods or practicals without the permission of the Class in charge Teacher / Principal.

- 10. Every student must always be modestly dressed and observe decorum with regard to both clothing and behavior and should take utmost care not to disturb the working of her own class as well as that of others. For self-financing courses students will have uniform approved by the management.
- 11. Students are not allowed to organize picnics/ activities without prior permission of the Principal.
- 12. No student shall collect any money as contribution towards picnics, trips, educational tours, get together, study-notes, charity or any other activity without the prior permission of the College Principal.
- 13. Every student should take utmost care of the college property to keep the College premises neat, tidy and clean for the common welfare of all. Any willful damage to the property of the College will be dealt with as breach of discipline and is liable for punishment. Such incidences should promptly be reported to the College Principal.
- 14. Students are requested to take care of their own property. The College Authorities are not responsible for the loss of any personal belongings of the students.
- 15. Students should deposit any lost property found by them in the College Office. Such incidences are displayed on the Notice Board. Owners of lost property should enquire and claim the same from the office.
- 16. If a student remains absent without giving a leave application for sizable length of time, her name is liable to be removed from the College rolls.
- 17. Students who fail to maintain the condition of minimum attendance on account of bonafide illness, or any other reason which is deemed right by the Principal, should apply in writing to the Principal for leave of absence, prior or

within 2 days from the date of commencement of such leave, failing which they will be treated as defaulters. Application forms are available within or 2 days after joining back (in case of illness) in our office.

- 18. Absence of the student on valid grounds at lectures/ practicals / tutorials / tests/ examinations must be communicated to the College Principal immediately in writing with the necessary supporting documents viz. Medical certificate etc. through the respective class teacher.
- 19. Students who request leave of absence from lectures/practical/tutorials for participation in sports, games, cultural or any other activities for and on behalf of the College/ Activity group, should submit the applications countersigned by the respective Teacher -in-charge before the commencement of such leave, failing which they will be treated as defaulters.
- 20. Parents/ Guardians if accompanying students should sign the visitors register at the gate and maintain decorum in the college.
- 21. All other relatives are directed to obtain written permission from the principal if they want to represent any student.
- 22. Parents of students are requested to kindly contact the Teacher-in-charge of class, Head of Department, Principal, at least once in a term, to keep themselves in touch with their ward's attendance and progress.
- 23. Counseling center and Mentor System: It has been observed that some of the students have personal problems, causing stress and strain. The college has appointed a councilor to help such students to cope with these problems. The students/ parents are requested to make use of this facility. All matters will be kept confidential. The college has also set up mentor System having teacher mentor to guide the students in their difficulties. In case of any problem, personal or

academic, students should report to the teacher-in-charge Mentor teacher who will help them solve their problems.

- 24. No society, association, committee, organization of students should be formed in the College without the sanction of the Principal.
- 25. Outsiders should not be invited to address any meeting or to participate in any college activity without the prior permission of the Principal.
- 26. A teacher conducting a class at a given time shall be in absolute control of the class, and may take appropriate action in order to maintain discipline in the class.
- 27. Any member of the teaching or non-teaching staff may intervene on the spot to deal with disorderly/ destructive activities on the part of the students either in the class room or outside the class room in the College premises.
- 28. Any matter not covered by the rules and regulation in vogue and/or notified through notices, circular, prospectus etc., will rest at the absolute discretion of the Principal. The right of interpretation of any rule is reserved by the Principal.
- 29. All rules and regulations enforced and implemented by the college / Management / U.G.C / University / Government from time to time will remain binding on students.
- 30. Any cost incurred by the college on account of communication owing to indiscipline/default of attendance / not appearing for mandatory internal examinations / viva / not submitting projects by students / any other matters pertaining to college administration related to students will be recovered from the concerned student.

RAGGING: A PUNISHABLE OFFENCE

PROHIBITION OF RAGGING UNDER H.P. EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTION ACT

(PROHIBITION OF RAGGING ACT ,2009) defines 'Ragging ' as doing any act, by disorderly conduct, to a student of an educational institution ,which causes or is likely to cause physical or psychological harm or raising apprehension or fear or shame or embarrassment to the student.

Such disorderly conduct includes, teasing or abusing or playing practical jokes on or causing hurt to such students or asking a student to do any act or perform something which such student, will not be willing to do in the ordinary course

A student who commits the offence of ragging shall be punishable with a imprisonment for a term which may extend to three years or shall also be liable to the fine which may extend Rs.50,000/- or both.

If a student is convicted of the charges of committing, abetting, participating or propagating ragging, he shall be dismissed from the college and such student will not get admission in any other college for a period of three years from the date of his dismissal from the college







Use of Mobile phones is strictly prohibited in classrooms and campus as per Government instruction strict action will be taken against the defaulters . Mobile phones can be used only in canteen and the common room

Breach of Discipline

- 1. Any disruptive activities or use of force.
- 2. Writing obscenities on walls, desks and blackboards.
- 3. Making noise or raising slogans that disturb teaching in the campus.
- 4. Smoking or entering the campus under the influence of drugs, liquor etc.
- 5. Plucking flowers or damaging the plants in college campus.
- 6. Bringing outsiders to the campus.
- 7. Tampering with electrical fittings, fans etc.
- 8. Misbehaviour of any kind.
- 9. Misbehaviour with female students.
- 10. Use of cell phones in classrooms, library, and in the campus and unauthorizeduse of loudspeakers, Public address systems. The teaching staff is vested with all the rights to punish or recommend for punishment any activity/ activities that amounts to breach of discipline.

b) Any examination of a Board/University/College/School in a foreign country recognized as equivalent for the purpose of eligibility by the Vice Chancellor/Equivalence Committee or on the recommendation of association of the Indian Universities, (AIU) House, with at least 40% marks and 35% marks in case of Schedules Caste/Scheduled Tribe Candidates.

Scheme of BCA Examination

- a) The duration of BCA shall be three years split over six semesters.
- b) There shall be an examination at the end of each semester in the month of April and October on the dates to be notified by the controller of Examinations HP University.
- c) The courses of study and syllabi shall be prescribed by the Board of Studies/Faculty from time to time. Other rules will be similar to those for the corresponding examination in the university.
- d) Pass percentage of marks: The pass marks in each paper shall be 40%.
- e) A candidate should have passed at least 50% papers of 1st years i.e. Ist and 2nd semester to get admission to 3rd semester of 2nd year and pass in 50% papers of Ist and 2nd year shall determine the eligibility for admission to 5th semester of 3rd year.
- f) A candidate obtaining pass marks in any course shall not be required to re-appear in the course again. However, the candidates shall be required to complete his BCA degree within maximum of 5 years.

- g) The successful candidates shall be classified in three divisions as under:
- i) First Division: Those who obtain 60% or more of the aggregate marks.
- ii) Second Division: Those who obtain 50% or more but less than 60% of the aggregate marks.
- iii) Third Division: Those who obtain less than 50% of the aggregate marks.

If a student fails in more than three papers, he/she shall be treated as failure in that class. The students can however, complete their graduation within five years from the date of examination to the course. Each theory paper will be of three hours duration with maximum of 70 marks, and 30 marks will be allotted for the Internal Assessment. There will a Practical Examination of 50 marks, and project work of 50 marks which is to be evaluated on the following basis:

(i) Project Report 10 marks(ii) Seminar 15 marks(iii) Viva-Voce 25 marks

RAGGING IS AN OFFENCE

"Ragging includes any type of Physical or mental torture inflicted by any individual or group, by words or in conduct, which creates an apprehension in the mind of a person that he/she cannot pursue his/her studies free from any mental disturbance or torture created there by any person who aids or abets such an action shall be guilty of such ragging."

Ragging includes display of noisy, disorderly conduct, teasing, rough or rude treatment, indulging in rowdy on disciplined and obscene activities which are likely to cause annoyance and hardship, physical or mental trauma or raise apprehension or fear in a fresher or other student, or forcing a student to do any act which such a student is not willing to do which causes him/ her shame or embarrassment or danger to her life or limb or indulging in eve teasing. Ragging in and out of the college campus/ hostel or road/ approaches leading thereto is strictly banned, if any student is found indulging in ragging directly, or indirectly, the college authorities shall be under obligation under rule 22, 17 (a) (b) (c) (d) of the HP University ordinance to expel the guilty students from the college/ Hostel. All Students who seek admission to the college/ hostel shall submit an undertaking this effect in their admission forms. Any student found guilty of ragging shall have to face disciplinary action and an FIR will be lodged with the police.

HOSTEL CHARGES & RULES

The Following rules must be observed by the inmates:

- 1. Entry of outsiders in hostel is strictly banned.
- 2. Use of drugs, intoxicants and smoking are strictly prohibited. Anyone found indulging in such

bad habits will be asked to evict the hostel immediately.

- 3. No inmate will be allowed to use electric appliances & tape recorders in the room.
- 4. No boarder is allowed to go out of hostel after the scheduled time without the permission of Hostel Warden.
- 5. On vacating the hostel, the boarder shall have to produce 'No Dues' certificate from the Hostel Warden. Boarder has to vacate the hostel within three days of the end of Academic Session.

INTRODUCTION

This scheme on skills development based higher education is a part of college/university education-leading to Bachelor of Vocation (B.Voc.) Degree with multiple exits such as Diploma/Advanced Diploma under the NSQF. The B.Voc. Programme is focused on universities providing undergraduate studies which would also incorporate specific job roles along with broad based general education. This would enable the graduates completing B.Voc. to make a meaningful participation in accelerating India's economy by gaining appropriate employment-becoming entrepreneurs and creating appropriate knowledge.

The proposed vocational programme is a judicious mix of skills-professional education related to respective sector and also appropriate content of general education. It is designed with the objective of equipping the students with requite set of practical and professional skills in respective sector.

CURRICULUM

The curriculum in each of the years of the programme would be a suitable mix of general education and skill development components.

DURATION

The duration of the B.Voc. shall be three years consisting of six semesters. The duration of each semester shall be five months inclusive of the days of examinations. There shall be at least 90 working days in a semester and a minimum 450 hours of learning in a semester.

PROGRAMME STRUCTURE

- General Education Components
- Skill Components
- Internship/Projects

CREDIT CALCULATION

The following formula is used for conversion of time into credit hours.

- One credit would mean equivalent of 15 periods of 60 minutes each for theory workshops/labs and tutorials;
- ❖ For internship / field work- the credit weightage for equivalent hours shall be 50% ofthat for lectures/workshops;
- For self-learning based on e-content or otherwise- the credit weightage for equivalent hours of study should be 50% or less of that for lecturers/workshops.

CONDITIONS FOR ADMISSIONS ELIGIBILITY:-

- The admission to B.Voc. programme will be as per the rules and regulations of the University for admissions.
- The eligibility criteria for admission to this B.Voc. Programme shall be 10+2 in any streams from a recognized board.
- Reservation rules are applicable as per Govt. of Himachal Pradesh.
- The eligibility criteria for admission shall be as announced by the University from time to time.
- Other conditions will be as laid down in admission policy in prospectus of the University.

ADMISSIONS:-

- The admission to B Voc., Semester 1st shall be done based on the merit in 10+2.
- A maximum of 40 students can be admitted to B.Voc. programme.
- There may be three types of candidates who can be given admission to first semester of skill based courses under NSQF: -

Category – 1: Students already acquired NSQF certification level 4 in a particular industry sector may opt admission in the skill based courses under NSQF.

Category – 2: Students who have acquired NSQF certification level 4 but may like to change their trade and may enter into skill based courses in a different trade.

Category – 3: Students passed 10+2 examination with conventional schooling without any background of vocational training.

- The eligibility criteria for admission shall be as announced by the university from time to time.
- Separate rank list shall be drawn up for reserved seats as per existing rules.
- Preferred subjects and index mark calculations will be decided by the respective Board of Studies. Reservation/
 Quota The reservation of seats shall be as per Himachal Pradesh Government Notification issued from time to
 time and as per the rules of the Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla.
- A maximum of 40 students can be admitted to one B.Voc. Programme.
- The students can be admitted only to the first semester. No student shall be admitted directly to third and fifth semester in any circumstance.
- In case where number of available seats is less and candidates secure same marks (percent) at the qualifying level examination, the admission of the candidate will be based upon securing higher marks in High School
- or equivalent examination.

- The applicants seeking re-entry into the education and training for further advanced leanings in their field of expertise in particular trade should get preference in admission over the new applicants.
- A candidate cannot pursue two full time Under-Graduate courses simultaneously.
- The University reserves the right to cancel any admission at any stage.
- In case of any matter relating to the Under-Graduate admissions, the decision of the Admission Committee/Vice-Chancellor Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla shall be final.
- All legal matters pertaining to the Under-Graduate admissions shall be subject to the Himachal Jurisdiction only.

AGE LIMIT FOR ADMISSION:-

For Girls 25 years as on 1st July 2023 and for boys 23 years as on 1st July 2023. However, the Vice Chancellor may grant relaxation for genuine reasons

MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTIONS

Medium of instruction shall be English.

BOARD OF STUDIES

- ❖ The B.Voc programmes in each sector will be attached to the Board of studies of the parent subject.
- ❖ An expert from industry sector shall be the member of affiliated BOS.
- ❖ The BOS shall be responsible for reviewing and approving the syllabus and provide suggestions in curriculum. BOS will decide the fee structure.

REGISTRATION/RE-REGISTRATION

Every candidate should register for all subjects of the Semester End examinations of each semester. A candidate who does not register will not be permitted to attend the Semester-End examinations; he/she shall not be permitted to attend the next semester. A candidate shall be eligible to register for any higher semester, if he/she has satisfactorily completed the course of study and registered for the examination. He/she should register for the semester at the start of the semester before the stipulated date. University will notify the starting and closing dates for each semester.

TEACHING

Methods of teaching shall be a combination of lectures, tutorials, seminars, educational tours, assignments, laboratory work, workshop practice, industrial training and project work. The regular faculty of the University, guest faculty from the reputed Organizations/ Institutes and Industrial Partners will be involved in teaching, practical and workshop practices. In addition, contractual faculties will also be involved in teaching and laboratory work/workshop practice. Distinguished experts shall also be invited for lectures and seminars on special topics.

ATTENDANCE


A candidate shall be permitted to Appear for the Semester End Examinations if he/she satisfies the following requirements.

a) Students are normally expected to attend 100% theory, tutorial and practical classes/ workshop practices. However, no student shall be allowed to appear in the end semester examination in the paper unless he/she has put in at least 75% attendance

- during the course of instruction in each paper separately for subjects of General Education and Skill Development Component of the vocational course is required.
- b) His/her conduct must be satisfactory
- c) A shortfall in attendance up to 10% can be condoned by the Vice-Chancellor of Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla once during the entire course provided such shortage is caused by continuous absence on genuine medical grounds.
- d) The attendance in theory and practical sessions will be considered separately. In the case of shortage of attendance, the cases will be considered as per the rules of the University

COURSE STRUCTURE

B. Voc. is programme with multiple exits. All the candidates continuing to diploma courses or further will be treated at par from the second semester onwards. Students may exit after six months with certificate (NSQF Level 4) or may continue for diploma or advance diploma level courses.



Following table shows the various certificates and their duration.

As per the UGC guidelines- there are multiple exit point for a candidate admitted in this course. If he/she is completing all the six credits successfully- he/she will get B. Voc degree in Hospitality and Tourism or in Retail Management. If he is completing the first four semesters successfully- he/she will get an advanced diploma in respective Sector. If he/she is completing the first two credits he/she will get a diploma in respective sector.

PROGRAMME DURATION

The duration of the B.Voc. programme shall be for a period of three years consisting of six semesters. The curriculum in each semester has been classified into General Component and Skill Component.

The General Education component shall include Theory subjects and the Skill Component shall include a mix of Theory, Practical and Internship.

GUIDELINES FOR CREDIT CALCULATION

Guidelines used for credit calculations are in alignment with the UGC Guidelines. The below norms are used for computation of credit hours:

- Under Skill Component:
 - **Theory:** 01 Credit = 15 hours of teaching
 - Practical/Internship: 01 Credit = 30 hours of training
- Under General Component:
 - Theory: 01 Credit = 15 hours of teaching

The below norms are used for computation of credits under Skill Component

- 50% weightage has been assigned to Theory
- 10% weightage has been assigned to Practical
- 40% weightage has been assigned to Internship

EVALUATION AND GRADING

The evaluation of each course shall contain two parts:

- I. Internal or In-Semester Assessment (ISA).
- II. External or End-Semester Assessment (ESA).

Sector Council Assessment will be done by the following steps:

- 1. Theory
- 2. Practical Work
- 3. Role Plays
- 4. Viva

The Sector Council assessment will be independent out of the University evaluation. The Final grade will be awarded after completion of both the evaluations successfully.

ASSESSMENT GUIDELINES

The Assessment and Certification for Skill Component of the Curriculum will be the responsibility of the Sector Skill Council.

The assessment by the Sector Council will be independent and out of the University evaluation. The Final grade and certificate will be awarded after successful completion of the evaluations.

The curriculum under Skill Component i.e. Theory, Practical and Internship will be under the purview of this assessment.

There will be two kinds of assessments for Skill Component:

- Internal Assessment (Formative Assessment)
- External Assessment (Summative Assessment)

The Internal Assessment (Formative Assessment):

This assessment will be done during the course of the semester. It will be a formative assessment which will aim to assess topics which are predominantly beyond purview of QP- NOS. This assessment will be done by the Training Partner.

Internal Assessment grade/marks will not be factored in the computation of the final External assessment. It will only serve as an input to identify strengths and areas of improvement of the student. This feedback will also provide input to the student for learning during Internship.

CERTIFICATION

On successful completion of the assessments by the assessment agency, the Sector Skill Council(THSC) will issue certificates to the passed students. How to apply:- A student can register online by visiting college website. Links for website is given below-
